- Wyoming's oldest Tree City



- Trapping
- Branch Sampling
- Tree Inventory
 - ~ 20,000 trees
 - City Land: 5% Ash
 - Street Trees: 15% Ash
- City-wide Ash: 15%
 - 3rd most common tree species






